- E. Vs 16—used the temple to increase their treasurers illegally.
- F. Vs 23-24—They omitted the most important parts of the Law.
- G. Vs 25-26—They did nothing to cor rect their hearts.
- H. Vs 27-28—They were like the whitewashed graves. Pretty on the outside and full of death on the inside.
 - i. Vs. 29-33—They built tombs for the prophets but rejected the prophets of their day.
 - ii. All of this, added fuel to their desire to kill Him.

Jesus Heals an Epileptic

- 1. Matthew 17:14-18
 - A. Mark 9:14-29
 - B. Scribes were among the multitude apparently to question Jesus on some point of law.
 - C. The disciples tried to heal the boy and could not.
 - D. Vs 17—Jesus was clearly upset with the failure of the people to grasp their rights as covenant people with God.
 - E. The boy had been possessed since childhood.
 - E. Mark 9:22—"If you can do anything .."
 - i. Jesus HAD to reply to this statement of unbelief.
 - ii. Vs 23— "if you can believe"
 - iii. Healing is based on faith, not need.
 - G. Jesus told the spirit never to return—LK 11:24-26.
 - H. The boy fell out under the power of God
- 2. Matthew 17:19-21
 - A. The disciples waited until everyone had left before they asked about their failure in curing the boy.
 - B. The disciples had not been taking time to fellowship with God and strengthen their spirits which comes through prayer and fasting.
 - C. Vs 20—They also simply did not believe what they were doing would work.

Other Miracles

- 1. Matthew 17:24-27.
 - A. Jesus and the disciples had been traveling

and had missed the scheduled payment of the tax for upkeep of the temple.

- B. Jesus did not have to pay because of who He was but did because He did not wish to offend anyone.
- 2. Luke 13:11-17.
 - A. The rulers of the synagogues did not like Him but could not keep Him out because of His popularity with the people.
 - B. Notice that when the woman was healed the ruler of the synagogue did not say anything directly to Jesus.
 - i. Religion had blinded him.
 - ii. He could not see his own hypocrisy.
 - C. Jesus rebuffed rulers' bigotry by showing him his own inconsistencies in keeping the Law.
- 3. Luke 14:1-5
 - A. Notice this was the house of a chief Pharisee.
 - B. Jesus healed the man of dropsy on the Sabbath.
 - C. In the Pharisee' mind it was alright to help an animal on Sabbath but not a sick man.
- 4. Luke 17:11-19.
 - A. Jesus is on His way to Jerusalem—Lk. 9:51-56.
 - B. The lepers stood far away because they did not want to pollute the people who were with Jesus.
 - C. The command to go to the priest.
 - I. The priest certified their healing.
 - 2. The priest gave them the right to return to society.
 - D. One returned to give thanks and was made whole.
- 5. Mark 10:46-52.

- A. Jesus ministry was coming to an end.
- B. Obviously Bartimaeus had heard of Jesus—Rom. 10:17
- C. The crowd tried to stop him from seeking after his miracle.
- D. The role of a blind man in those days is the white-tipped cane of the blind today.

Zacchaeus

- 1. Luke 19:1-6.
 - A. Passover was drawing near and great crowds were on their way to Jerusalem and it was customary to stay the night in Jericho.
 - B. Zacchaeus was a crooked tax collector.
 - C. He must have desired a better life and went to great effort to merely get a glimpse of Jesus.
- 2. Luke 19:7-10.
 - A. By merely showing kindness to this hard man Jesus caused a life-changing experience in his life.
 - B. No doubt life in Jericho was better after wards.
- 3. John 12:1-5.
 - A. Jesus returns to Bethany.
 - i. Simon the Leper healed in Bethany— Matt. 26:6.
 - ii. Lazarus had been raised from the dead here.
 - B. There was a warrant out for His arrest..
 - C. Mary shared her deep love for Him.
 - D. Judas was upset because he was the treasurer and had been stealing from the bag.
 - E. Mark 14:6-9—Jesus defended Mary.
 - F. Matt. 16:14-16—Judas makes
