Palm Sunday

1. Mark 11:1-11.

- A. Luke 19:29-40
- B. The disciples found things just as He had said
- C. Jesus was offering Himself to the nation as the Messiah.
- D. The nation regarded Him as a prophet. Matt. 21:11.

2. Luke 19:41-44.

- A. Jesus wept over Jerusalem.
- B. Within forty years Titus would destroy the city.
- 3. Mark 11:15-19.
- A. Jesus came back to the temple the next day after seeing it the evening before.
- B. The temple had been turned into a marketplace once again. He had cleansed it 3 years before.
- C. After he cleansed it again the sick came back in and were healed. Matt. 21:12-15.
