- 2. John 9:3-7.
  - A. Sin is not always the direct result of sin in a person's life but can be the result of sin being in the earth-John 10:10.
  - There are no punctuation marks in the Greek B. text.
    - i. God did not make the man blind so lesus could heal him.
    - ii. The work of God in the man was not the blindness but the healing that was to occur.
- 3. John 9:13-34.
  - A. Pharisees again are not interested in the miracle but in the keeping of Sabbath. They were truly blinded by their religious tradition.
  - B. The man's parents wanted to avoid the wrath of the Pharisees because of vs. 22.
  - C. The beggar had more common sense than they did.
- 4. John 9:35-38.
  - A. Jesus comes to confront him.
  - Reveals Himself as the Messiah to him. B.

- 3. Did not fast often enough.
  - A. Matthew 9:15.
  - B. Matthew 17:21
  - $\label{eq:c.His} \text{C.} \quad \text{His own ministry began with a 40 day fast.}$
- 4. Involved with sinners.
  - A. Luke 5:31.
  - B. Pharisees had nothing to do with publicans and sinners.
- 5. Did not keep the Sabbath.
  - A. The greatest teachings of the elders evolved around the Sabbath.
  - B. Matthew 12:1,2.
  - C. Matthew 12:9-14—healing of the man with the withered hand.
  - D. Matthew 12:8—He was Lord of the Sabbath.
- 6. Matthew 12:22-28.
  - A. Pharisees claimed Jesus healed the man by the power of Satan.
  - B. Jealousy caused them to make the ridiculous charge.
  - C. Jesus tore their argument apart.
- 7. Matthew 12:31-32.
  - A. Unpardonable sin committed by the Pharisees.
  - B. Attributed the miracle—working power of the Holy Spirit to that of Satan.
  - C. II Thes. 2:10-12.

- 8. Mark 3:21-35.
  - A. Opposition grew to such a point it began to affect His family.
  - B. His mother and brothers thought He had lost His mind.
  - C. They came to talk to Him and help Him regain His senses.

  - B. Mark 6:5—Could not do any miracles because of their unbelief.
  - C. Rejected again by His hometown.

  - B. Division among the people as to His purpose.
  - C. Verse 13—shows the animosity was growing rapidly.
- 3. John 7:14-31.
  - A. Pharisees could not believe He knew so much and had never been to their schools.
  - B. Verse 19-20—Word of knowledge.
  - C. Verse 23—Pharisees still upset about man of Pool of Bethesda.
- 4. Verse 28-39—Prophecy concerning the Holy Spirit.
- 5. John 7:43.
  - A. Because of division among the people, Pharisees sent officers to arrest Him.

B. Verse 50—Nicodemus raised point of order.

- I. John 8:1-2.
  - A. Left the temple and went to Mt. Olives.
  - B. Came back to temple in the morning and taught the people gathered there.
- 2. John 8:3-11.
  - A. Law of Moses decreed adultery punishable by death.
  - B. Where was the man? Possibly one of their own allowed to escape.
  - C. Pharisees were sure they had Jesus.
    - 1. They knew He loved sinners but could not break the law.
    - 2. If He condemned her He would shock the people because of His teachings on love and mercy.
  - D. No one knows what He wrote in the sand.
    - 1. Perhaps their own sins.
    - 2. Maybe the name of the Pharisee who committed adultery with the woman.
  - E. His reply allowed the Law to stand but struck at their own hearts.
- 3. John 8:12-59.
  - A. Makes many of His greatest statements concerning His purpose for being there, preexistence, and what He would do in a person's life who accepted Him.
  - B. Verse 59—Jews became so infuriated they tried to kill Him.
